What would you sacrifice for the sake of those you love the most?





A NEW FOLK MUSICAL

"In the Midst of Plenty" is a new work of historical drama set in 1847, at the height of Ireland's Great Famine. Featuring an original score of contemporary acoustic folk music performed by a cast of professional actors and a live folk band, it tells the story of Bridget Connor, a tenant on the Strokestown estate, as she struggles to protect her family from the forces of starvation, eviction, and emigration.



CONNECTING WITH AUDIENCES

Enchanted Croí Theatre was awarded funding from the Roscommon County Council's Local Live Performance Programming Scheme to stage "In the Midst of Plenty" in the National Famine Museum at Strokestown Park in June 2022. The show sold out all 300 tickets, and was immediately awarded another round of funding from the Roscommon County Council. It went on to sell out both nights of performances (400 tickets) in the Roscommon Arts Centre in September 2022. Recognized for sensitively reflecting the resilience of so many Irish families and members of the global Irish diaspora, the show has seen great demand for a tour across Ireland.



A LOVE LETTER TO IRISH HISTORY

The show's writer/composer, **Amy Day**, and the show's director, **Anne-Marie O'Sullivan**, collaborate out of a shared passion for the Strokestown story and a mutual belief that theatre should be used to illuminate some of history's most compelling moments. Written under the guidance of a leading Famine historian and **incubated on the grounds of the National Famine Museum**, the show's plot, music, dialogue, sets, costumes, and props reflect a thoughtful use of the historical record, breathing new life into treasured materials. 




Director Anne-Marie O'Sullivan pays particular attention to archival material in the show's costumes, sets, and props. Below, the sketch of the costume designed for Mary Duffy features an illustration of a blighted potato plant, and the first pair of shoes Mary owned in many years.





ARCHIVES ALIVE

Mary's shawl bears the names of the 1490 emigrants forced to leave Strokestown by foot to board the infamous coffin ships across the Atlantic. The drawn shoes, below, are bound in an image of the route they walked to Dublin, memorialized today as the National Famine Way. Through its "Archives Alive" project, Enchanted Croí



HISTORICAL COSTUMING

Below, Denis Mahon is seen wearing a top hat that is decoupaged with many of the Roscommon's **Relief Committee** documents, and a waistcoat made up of petitions sent to him by his suffering tenantry, begging for mercy. At right, the red seals on these documents become bullet wounds, as his grieving widow holds up the garment and cries out in realization of what her family has become.



EXPLORING POWER AND PRIVILEGE

Henrietta Mahon, the wife of the landlord, is seen above in a dress that bears the imagery of the British empire. Below are her letters, found in the Strokestown archive, which offer insight into her character and her priorities. Designed by Anne-Marie O'Sullivan, Enchanted Croí Theatre works with skilled Roscommon artists to create garments infused with meaning.
